## HISTORY OF THE U.S. CONSULATE GENERAL IN SHANGHAI

The present American Consulate General is located at 1469 Huai Hai Zhong Lu (formerly Avenue Joffre). The original owner of the old residence in which the Consulate is housed was reportedly a Minister (Shang Shu) in the Qing Government and one of China's most prominent entrepreneurs. While serving as Finance Minister he acquired great wealth, but subsequent generations squandered much of it and the house passed out of the family's hands.

In the 1920's the mansion was sold to the British trading company Jardine Matheson (or "Ewo"). As late as 1939 the mansion was still listed as being a company residence, probably that of its general manager. When World War II was approaching, Jardine's leased the building to the Swiss government for its consulate, which it remained throughout the war. In 1946 Jardine Matheson sold the property to Rong Hongyuan (Yung Hung Yuen), a member of one of Shanghai's wealthiest families. One member of the family, Rong Yiren, remains in China today as a prosperous businessman and government official. The current owner is a member of the Rong family who currently lives in Brazil.

Some time after the communist take-over in 1949, with the confiscation of property the house became the headquarters of the Shanghai branch of the All-China Women's Federation, which it remained until the onset of the so-called "Cultural Revolution" in 1966. During the subsequent years of chaos the building was occasionally used for "political education classes" but was otherwise locked up and placed under guard to prevent destruction. With the end of the Cultural Revolution the mansion served as a guest house until it was leased in 1980 by the United States Government for its newly-reopened Consulate General.

In addition to the main house, the property consists of over three acres of gardens, including a large lawn, a traditional Chinese rock garden, an orange grove, a gazebo and a carp pond. Outbuildings formerly used for garages and servants' quarters now house the consular and general services offices.

When the present building was opened as a Consulate General in 1980, it was the first American Consulate in Shanghai for thirty years. The earliest U.S. Consulate was located north of Soochow Creek in Hongkew District at 13/19 Whangpoo Road, where its red brick building and grounds overlooked the Whangpoo River. In 1930 the Consulate moved to the Kalee Hotel at 181 Kiangse (now Jiangxi) Road, opposite the Trinity (Anglican) Cathedral. At a later date it moved to the Development Building at the corner of Kiangse and Foochow Roads, across from the Hamilton House (north side) and the Metropole Hotel (southside) on Foochow Road. The American Club was at that time located in a purpose-built building farther east on the same road.

In 1949, after the founding of the People's Republic of China, most Americans departed Shanghai. The American Consulate closed to the public on March 15, 1950, and was officially closed when the American flag was last lowered over the premises on April 25, 1950. This flag is now displayed in the lobby of the Consulate General.

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IN SHANGHAI

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During World War II the Swiss Consulate General occupied the property. In 1946 Jardine Matheson sold the property to Rong Hongyuan (Yung Hung Yuen), a member of one of Shanghai's wealthiest industrial families. Mr. Rong, who is apparently still the owner, lives in Brazil. One member of the family, Rong Yiren, remains in China today as a prosperous businessman and government official.

Some time after 1949 the house became the headquarters of the Shanghai Branch of the All-China Women's Federation. They occupied the property until the onset of the so-called "Cultural Revolution" in 1966. During the subsequent ten years of chaos the building was occasionally used for "political education classes" but was otherwise locked and placed under guard to prevent looting. With the end of the Cultural Revolution the property served as a guest house until it was leased by the American Consulate General in 1980.

In addition to the main building, which is used for offices and the Consul General's residence, the property has over three acres of gardens, including a large lawn, a traditional Chinese rock garden, a gazebo, a carp pool and an orange grove. Outbuildings are occupied by the Consular and Administrative sections.

When the present building was opened in 1980 it was the first U.S. Consulate building in Shanghai for thirty years. The earliest American Consulate was located north of Suzhou Creek in Hongkou at 13/19 Whangpu Road, where its grounds overlooked the Whangpu River. In 1930 the Consulate moved to the "Kalée Hotel" at 181 Jiangsu Lu, corner of Jiujiang Road. From there it moved to the Development Building at the corner of Jiangxi Lu and Fuzhou Lu, across from the Hamilton House (north side) and Metropole Hotel (south side) on Fuzhou Lu.

In 1949 after the founding of the People's Republic of China, most Americans departed Shanghai. The American Consulate closed to the public on March 15, 1950, and was officially closed on April 25, 1950.

## HISTORY OF THE U.S. CONSULATE GENERAL

### SHANGHAI

We are frequently asked about the history of the buildings and grounds the Consulate General now occupies in Shanghai. Since our arrival here in February of 1980, we have been able to piece together a rough outline which visitors to Shanghai may find of interest.

The original owner, reportedly, was a Minister (Shang Shu) in the Qing Government and one of China's most prominent entrepreneurs. He acquired great wealth, but subsequent generations squandered much of it, and the house was sold to the British trading company of Jardine Matheson, probably in the 1920s. Jardine used it as the residence of its general manager.

When World War II was approaching, Jardine either sold or leased the building to the Swiss Government as its Consulate General, which it remained throughout the war. After the war the house again reverted to private ownership, being purchased by the Rong family, one of Shanghai's wealthiest industrial families. One member of the family, Rong Yiren, remains in China today as the head of the China International Trust and Investment Corporation (CITIC). The current owner is a member of the Rong family who lives in Brazil.

Sometime after 1949, the house became the headquarters of the Shanghai branch of the All-China Women's Federation, which it remained for about fifteen years until the onset of the Cultural Revolution. During the following years of chaos, the building was simply locked up and placed under guard to prevent looting. With the end of the Cultural Revolution, the building served as a guest house until we leased the premises for the first U.S. Consulate General in Shanghai in thirty years.

In addition to the main building, which is used for offices and as a residence for the Consul General, the property has three and a half acres of gardens, including a large lawn, a traditional Chinese rock garden, a small orange grove and a green house (currently used for a nursery school). Other outbuildings are now occupied by the Shanghai American School, and the Consulate's Press and Cultural and Commercial Sections.

Earlier locations: In 1931 the Consulate General was located in the "Kalee Hotel" opposite Trinity Cathedral (191 Kiangse Road). From there it moved to the Development Building, at the corner of Jiangxi and Fuzhou Roads, across from Hamilton House (north side) and Hotel Metropol (south side of Fuzhou Road).

On April 23, for the first time in 30 years, the American flag was raised at the American Consulate General in Shanghai. The flag raising was an informal ceremony attended by Ambassador Leonard Woodcock, EA/PRCM Director Charles Freeman, who represented the Department, and the Consulate General staff and families. Immediately following the flag raising, Ambassador Woodcock and Consul General Donald Anderson co-hosted a reception for Chinese and American guests and the Consular Corps. In addition, eight employees of our former Consulate General in Shanghai were present. Although the guest list was limited to 250 people, an estimated 400 actually showed up.

Heading the list of distinguished Chinese guests were Shanghai's Vice Mayor Zhao Xingzhi; Zhang Chengzong, Vice Chairman of the Standing Committee of the Shanghai People's Congress; and Zhang Gengping, Secretary General of the Shanghai Municipal People's Government. The Chinese Foreign Ministry was represented by the Director of the American and Oceanian Department, Ambassador Han Xu.

The opening of the Consulate General in Shanghai marks the completion of the agreement reached during the visit to the United States by Vice Premier Deng Xiaoping to open two consulates general each in the United States and China. The American Consulate General in Guangzhou was opened by Vice President Mondale during his visit to China last year, and both of the Chinese Consulates General in Houston and San Francisco were opened late in 1979.

The new Consulate General in Shanghai initially will have a staff of eight Americans, and will offer the full range of consular services with the exception of immigrant visas. Indicative of things to come was the fact that at six o'clock in the morning the day after the Consulate General opened, there were 50 visa applicants waiting. The Consulate General will have an important role in economic/commercial relations with China. As China's premier industrial center and largest port, Shanghai accounts for fully 30 percent of all Chinese exports. Since Shanghai is a major educational and intellectual center, the Consulate General will also have a Branch Public Affairs Office.

The Consulate General is housed in a large western-style mansion located at 1469 Huai Hai Middle Road. It has approximately three acres of some of the most beautiful gardens in all of Shanghai. The building will serve both as an office and as the residence for Consul General and Mrs. Anderson.



### PARS FROM THE PRESS

THE country will now bind to her service thousands of the most carefully taught, the most honourable, the most intelligent, and the most patriotic of her children. We mean the boys and girls who are being trained in such institutions as St. John's at Jessfield. It would have been a most serious thing if the foolish discrimination of the Imperial Government against such institutions had been continued. That such is not to be is matter for the sincerest congratulation.—*The Shanghai Mercury*.

To seize people and forcibly cut off their queue, as the revolutionaries have been doing, is to deprive the individual of his right to free choice and to subject him to an indignity. If the Chinese want to

wear foreign caps, let them do so by all means; there is no need to make us believe they are doing so out of servility when such is not the case.—*China Weekly*.

THAT the Manchus must be made to agree, but it would be better for China to reflect whether the reform must go also, and what the meaning of nationality and symbol of a republic is likely to prove for the people of China. And in so doing, reformers may ask themselves what it was that brought all the streets to welcome back the Queen.—*The North-China*

## HISTORY OF THE AMERICAN CONSULATE GENERAL IN SHANGHAI

The present American Consulate General is located at 1469 Huai Hai Zhong Lu (formerly Avenue Joffre). The original owner of the residence reputedly was the Finance Minister in the Qing Government and one of China's most prominent entrepreneurs. In the 1920's the property was sold to Jardine Matheson (called "Ewo"), a British Trading Company. As late as 1939 the Shanghai Directory lists it as being a company residence, probably for their general manager.

During World War II the Swiss Consulate General occupied the property. In 1946 Jardine Matheson sold the property to Rong Hongyuan (Yung Hung Yuen), a member of one of Shanghai's wealthiest industrial families. Mr. Rong, who is apparently still the owner, lives in Brazil. One member of the family, Rong Yiren, remains in China today as a prosperous businessman and government official.

Some time after 1949 the house became the headquarters of the Shanghai Branch of the All-China Women's Federation. They occupied the property until the onset of the so-called "Cultural Revolution" in 1966. During the subsequent ten years of chaos the building was occasionally used for "political education classes" but was otherwise locked and placed under guard to prevent looting. With the end of the Cultural Revolution the property served as a guest house until it was leased by the American Consulate General in 1980.

In addition to the main building, which is used for offices and the Consul General's residence, the property has over three acres of gardens, including a large lawn, a traditional Chinese rock garden, a gazebo, a carp pool and an orange grove. Outbuildings are occupied by the Consular and Administrative sections.

After a hiatus of thirty years, the U.S. Consulate reopened at its present site in 1980. The earliest American Consulate was located north of Suzhou Creek in Hongkou at 13/19 Whangpu Road, where its grounds overlooked the Whangpu River. In 1930 the Consulate moved to the "Kalee Hotel" at 181 Jiangsu Lu, corner of Jiujiang Road. From there it moved to the Development Building at the corner of Jiangxi Lu and Fuzhou Lu, across from the Metropole Hotel (north side) and Hamilton House (south side) on Fuzhou Lu.

In 1949 after the founding of the People's Republic of China, most Americans departed Shanghai. The American Consulate closed to the public on March 15, 1950, and was officially closed on April 25, 1950.



## U.S. CONSULATE SHANGHAI NONIMMIGRANT VISA APPLICATION INFORMATION

The American Consulate General is located at 1469 Huai Hai Zhong Road, at the intersection with Wulumuqi Road. The Visa Section issues only non-immigrant visas. The Consulate processes visa applications for applicants residing or working within the Shanghai consular district, which is composed of Shanghai, Jiangsu, Zhejiang and Anhui provinces. All immigrant visa applications including K-1 (fiancé) visas are processed at the American Consulate General in Guangzhou (Tel: 020-8188-8911, Fax: 020-8186-2341).

### Nonimmigrant Visa Application Procedures

- **Application Fee**

Each applicant must pay a 405 RMB visa application fee. This fee must be paid at one of the following CITIC Bank locations: 61 Nanjing East Road, Shanghai; 1355 Huai Hai Middle Road, Shanghai; 1574 Nanjing West Road, Shanghai; 710 Dong Fang West Road, Shanghai; Jinluan Mansion (10<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> Floor), 101 South Zhongshan Road, Nanjing; 188 ZhuHui Road, Suzhou; 88 YanAn Road, Hangzhou. The application fee is non-refundable.

- **Application Forms**

When the applicant pays the 405 RMB application fee, he/she will receive a visa application form (OF-156) and a Family Information Sheet free of charge. All forms must be completed prior to the appointment. The OF-156 form must be completed entirely in English (the Family Information Sheet may be completed in Chinese). Each application must also contain two 37 mm by 37 mm photographs showing the applicant full face without head covering against a light background.

- **Passport**

Applicants must hold a passport valid for travel to the United States with a validity date of at least six months beyond the applicant's intended stay in the U.S.

- **Other Documents**

The Consulate recommends that documentation submitted in support of visa cases be translated into English. F-1 and F-2 applicants must bring their original I-20 forms to the visa

interview, and J-1 and J-2 applicants must bring their original IAP-66 forms to the visa interview. All petition-based applicants (H1B, L, O, P, and Q visas) must bring their original INS approved I-797A forms to the visa interview.

- **Scheduling an Interview**

All applicants traveling to the United States for the first time on a private passport, and applicants who do not meet the requirements for the prior travel program must make an appointment for a visa interview. To schedule a visa interview, please call **021-6471-1451** or **021-6471-1429** Monday through Friday, 8:00 am – 12:00 p.m. or 1:00- 5:00 p.m.

Any visa applicant that has been previously refused a U.S. visa must state so at the time the appointment is scheduled. A prior refusal does not prohibit an applicant from scheduling another visa interview. If an applicant does not admit to a previous refusal when the appointment is scheduled, the Consulate will be unable to process the application when the applicant comes to the Consulate for his/her interview. **Also, please note: all applicants who have been refused for the 2<sup>nd</sup> or greater time after June 01, 2000, will not be granted another interview until six months after the date of their last refusal.** F-1 student visa applicants are exempt from this requirement.

The U.S. Consulate cannot interview visa applicants who have not scheduled an appointment. Visa appointments can only be scheduled via telephone and may not be made in person at the Consulate nor via fax or e-mail. There is no fee for scheduling an appointment. If the appointment line is busy, please call again.

- **CITIC Prior Travel Program**

Applicants who meet all of the following requirements may submit visa applications at the following CITIC branches: 61 Nanjing East Road, Shanghai; 1355 Huai Hai Middle Road, Shanghai; Jinluan Mansion (10<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> Floor), 101 South Zhongshan Road, Nanjing; 188 ZhuHui Road, Suzhou; 88 Yan An Road, Hangzhou. **(Note: There is an additional 200 RMB non-refundable fee for using the CITIC bank prior travel program.)** Eligible applicants also have the option of scheduling a regular visa interview at the Consulate, if they do not wish to participate in the CITIC Prior Travel Program.

In order to qualify to use this program, applicants must:

- Hold a previous U.S. visa in their private passport **and**
- Be applying for the same class of U.S. visa **and**
- Not have been refused a U.S. visa since they last traveled to the U.S. **and**
- Have traveled to the U.S. within the last five years **and**
- Not have exceeded the time limit for their stay in the U.S. authorized by I.N.S.

F, J, H, and L visa holders must be returning to the same institutions as their original visa states, or be travelling on the original valid INS petition.

Applicants with prior travel to the United States on a public affairs passport are not eligible for this program.

Miscellanea

In 1931, the American Consulate General was on Jiangxi Road, opposite the Holy Trinity (Anglican) Cathedral.

The British Country Club is on Nanjing Road. It is now the compound belonging to the television studio, and contains the tall TV tower.

The Ward Road Jail still exists on Changzhi Dong Lu. It is now often referred to as the Tilanqiao (Small Basket Bridge) Jail, after the district surrounding it.

The British American Tobacco Company Building was on the corner of Museum Road and Suzhou Road, right down from the Union Church on Suzhou Road. (The church now has a new facade but you can still see the gothic windows and steeple above.)

The Jewish Synagogue (Sephardic, with services in Arabic) was located at No. 50 Museum Road, right next to Shanghai's Museum.\* It has a new facade and a greenish plastic awning over the front, but you can still see the Menorah (five-pronged candle holders) on either side of the awning, and the dome is unchanged. (\*The Royal Asiatic Museum)

The Ruijin Guest House was the Morris Family compound and covers almost an entire city block. The Morris Family were owners of the North China Daily News, the oldest English-language newspaper in China. The last owner, a bachelor, lived in the small house near the front of the compound (there are four houses and a gate-house on the compound). Mr. Morris was a breeder of racing dogs and the Canidrome (dog racing track) is at the back of the property; originally his kennels were also back there. He died in Shanghai after the Liberation, and his possessions were displayed by the police as "smuggled goods". (One of the buildings was used as the Italian Embassy during the Second World War.)

Cemeteries: The original Jewish cemetery was on Baikal Road. The Hongqiao Cemetery was on the northwest corner of Columbia and Hongqiao Roads. (It was trashed by Red Guards during the first days of the Cultural Revolution and nothing remains.) There is another western cemetery on Hongqiao Road, a little further west, where Song Qingling (Mme. Sun Yat-sen) is buried. There used to be 600 or more western graves there, but it too was destroyed during the CR, and only about fifty western graves (including some of the old Jewish families) still remain. The Jing An Cemetery on Bubbling Wells Road (it runs through the whole block to Jing An) is now the Jing An Park. Thus there is only one cemetery still containing western graves--the one mentioned above on Hongqiao Road where Mme. Sun is buried.

During the Second World War, the Jewish Ghetto was in Wayside District (north of Suzhou Creek) between Broadway and Yangtzepoo Road. If Jews had a pass, they could leave it to work in the city. There were many temporary synagogues in the Ghetto, but usually in buildings having other functions; none survives.

The Da Shijie Amusement Center (in Shanghai dialect: Dasigā) still survives intact, but as a Communist Youth Palace. The bomb which fell in the street in front of it in 1937 damaged it only slightly.

THE AMOY AMERICAN CONSULATE--REDISCOVERED

On a recent trip to southeast China's Fuzhou Province arranged by the Shanghai Foreign Affairs Office, a Shanghai ConGen contingent, including the author, decided to try to find the old American Consulate building, abandoned in 1950. We knew that it had been located on Gulangyu (the island off Xiamen, which was Amoy's pre-revolutionary name). This lovely wooded island had been a resort area since the arrival of the Europeans in the nineteenth century and is appropriately called "The Garden on the Sea."

China -- A Commercial and Industrial Handbook, published in 1926 by the Department of Commerce, states that the United States was one of the nine countries having consular representation in the Amoy Consular District, which comprised approximately 20,000 square miles and had a population of 6,000,000. In Amoy itself there were British and Japanese Concessions as well as a small nominal American one on the harbor front. A 1924 breakdown of the Consular District foreign population by countries reveals:

Americans (including 91 Philippine Chinese)....	233
British.....	243
Danish.....	10
Dutch.....	101
French.....	38
Japanese and Formosans.....	6,298
Russians.....	<u>2</u>

TOTAL: 6,925.

About the island, the handbook noted: "Kulangsu, a small island opposite Amoy, a mile long and one-half mile wide, was made an international settlement by China in 1903. It forms the foreign consular and residential section of the port...The foreign population of the island is placed at 300 and the Chinese at 40,000. In addition there is also a Japanese and Formosan population at about 800."

Now only Chinese live on the island, but the foreigners left a legacy of hundreds of classical (and some less so) buildings. To add to its charm, the island is devoid of car and bicycle traffic. A stroll through its tranquil, narrow streets offers the visitor a wonderful array of varying facades, gables and gates, as well as occasional glimpses into charming courtyards and now and then a breathtaking vista of the sea.

As I had a vague recollection of an old picture of the old American Consulate building with its white columns and a red star over the door, we kept wandering and asking, primarily the older residents who might remember the Consulate from former days. We very quickly got a lucky hit: A toothless old gentlemen pointed us in the right direction and we started searching for the columned portico among the old European style houses. We craned our necks to see above high walls and through the crevices of ornate, locked gates. On and on we wandered, searching left and right in the numerous small lanes.

Suddenly there it was, red brick with white columns and complete with the star--just as I had recalled in the picture. The gate was closed but the caretaker let us in. The lawns are all weeds now and unclipped hedges tower above the entry walkway.

Inside the building, although badly deteriorating, the architecture is lovely: high ceilings, crown molding, parquet floors, marble fireplaces, well proportioned rooms. In the ground floor's main parlour an ornately carved counter still stands in forlorn splendor midst trash and debris. We hypothesized that this was the counter from which a receptionist dispensed information to the Consulate's clients.

We wandered through room after room. Some of them had been badly partitioned into smaller rooms, but even truncated they revealed their original grand scale. There were large bathrooms and a nicely tiled kitchen. French doors led out onto a terrace facing the sea. A climb to the second floor was more disheartening, revealing a falling ceiling, peeling walls, more debris from subsequent tenants.

French windows still opened onto small balconies under the porch overhang and looked down on a now desolate garden. There was an upper garden to the left of the house, up some stone stairs beyond the servants' wing. The Consulate had served both as an office and a residence for its officers. In its 15+ rooms there was certainly space for all.

Most dramatic on the second floor was a long gallery running along the right side of the house and facing the sea. This offered an unparalleled view--of a factory that had been built on the premises. The caretaker volunteered that between the Consulate and the water there was at one time a garden so large that it was later converted into a ball field. The white columns of the front of the building are

repeated here on the side with dramatic effect, although the once open gallery facing the sea is now glassed in.

When asked if there was anything left from the American tenancy, the caretaker indicated that there were still some items in the attic. I climbed the rickety backstairs to find a steel cage across the entry. The skylight revealed only piles of battered office furniture and a few broken lamps and dishes of no great distinction. I did not try the rusty grill's lock, as the flooring looked totally unreliable. It also seemed unlikely that anything of interest could have survived subsequent tenants and the destructive frenzies of the Cultural Revolution.

The present caretaker is not the one who guarded the property after 1950. He said that the earlier one had been pensioned off by the U.S. Government some years ago. The current one, however, was very helpful during our ramble--mostly in impenetrable Fujianese dialect. He told us that the Philippine Consulate had taken over the premises after the Americans had pulled out and had stayed there for six years. He pointed above the door to the place where a great seal obviously had been affixed, a darkened round circle with bolt-holes (just the size of the seal over the door of the Consulate General building in Shanghai--we checked it out when we got back).

The tranquility of the setting and the sad dignity of the derelict old Consulate building afforded us a nostalgic glimpse into a bit of United States consular life in old China.






The Consular jail occupies the second floor of No. 15. The present staff consists of:—

### National American Products

#### WATER

THIS necessary product is used in bath-tubs, Wall Street, and California wines. It is one of our absolute necessities. It is all that the Panama Canal lacks. Mixed with earth, it makes a splendid and universal campaign material. HISTORY OF THE AMERICAN CONSULATE GENERAL  
IN SHANGHAI

The present American Consulate General is located at 1469 Huai Hai Zhong Lu (formerly Avenue Joffre). The original owner of the residence reputedly was the Finance Minister in the Qing Government and one of China's most prominent entrepreneurs. In the 1920's the property was sold to Jardine Matheson (called "Ewo"), a British Trading Company. As late as 1939 the Shanghai Directory lists it as being a company residence, probably for their general manager.

During World War II the Swiss Consulate General occupied the property. In 1946 Jardine Matheson sold the property to Rong Hongyuan (Yung Hung Yuen), a member of one of Shanghai's wealthiest industrial families. Mr. Rong, who is apparently still the owner, lives in Brazil. One member of the family, Rong Yiren, remains in China today as a prosperous businessman and government official.

Some time after 1949 the house became the headquarters of the Shanghai Branch of the All-China Women's Federation. They occupied the property until the onset of the so-called "Cultural Revolution" in 1966. During the subsequent ten years of chaos the building was occasionally used for "political education classes" but was otherwise locked and placed under guard to prevent looting. With the end of the Cultural Revolution the property served as a guest house until it was leased by the American Consulate General in 1980.

In addition to the main building, which is used for offices and the Consul General's residence, the property has over three acres of gardens, including a large lawn, a traditional Chinese rock garden, a gazebo, a carp pool and an orange grove. Outbuildings are occupied by the Consular and Administrative sections.

When the present building was opened in 1980 it was the first U.S. Consulate building in Shanghai for thirty years. The earliest American Consulate was located north of Suzhou Creek in Hongkou at 13/19 Whangpu Road, where its grounds overlooked the Whangpu River. In 1930 the Consulate moved to the "Kalee Hotel" at 181 Jiangsu Lu, corner of Jiujiang Road. From there it moved to the Development Building at the corner of Jiangxi Lu and Fuzhou Lu, across from the Hamilton House (north side) and Metropole Hotel (south side) on Fuzhou Lu.
